GUY LAMBERT MASTER OF CEREMONIES



Guy Lambert has worked in broadcast radio for over 20 years. Currently serving as the news director and anchor for the “The Joe Clair Morning Show on Washington DC’s hit music station, WPGC 95.5 FM and cohost of “The Hughley Truth”, a weekly podcast hosted by comedian DL Hughley. He is also the host of Community Focus, a one-hour weekly community affairs show on WPGC which highlights people and events of influence in the local community. His history in broadcast radio expands across various markets and popular morning shows including The Donnie Simpson Show, the Gig Tigger Show, Funky Larry Jones Morning Show, and the Tom Joyner Morning Show.

In addition to being a staple in radio and in high demand in TV, Guy Lambert has maintained an elite reputation as an event host, emcee, and entertainment correspondent nationwide. He served as the 2015 Soul Music awards red carpet correspondent for Centric TV.

For two NFL seasons, and counting Guy served as co-host for “Around the League”, a segment on Fox weekly NFL show, “Redskins Game Time.” In 2017, Guy earned his own weekly segment on the Saturday morning news where he was the co-host with Annie Yu, “get Up with Guy.”

Throughout his career, Guy has served as a great correspondent for several news media outlets. He was a contributor to CNN, serving as a political analyst. In 2009 – 2011, he was a regular correspondent on the Lou Dobbs Show.

Guy works closely with the National Urban League of Greater Washington, the Mayor’s Office of Washington, DC, the Howard Theatre, Lindsey Cadillac, the Washington Wizards, and Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc.

The Honorable Andrea O. Bailey, Virginia Potomac District Supervisor. Andrea Olivia Bailey is a native of St. Louis, Missouri living in Dumfries, Va. She is the only child of Mr. and Mrs. John Earl Pullman. She is a Christian woman who has been a military spouse for 23 years, a Christian and Diaconate leader and teacher for over 40 years, and is now a caregiver for her mother since 2012.

Mrs. Bailey is also a 20 year veteran of the corporate private sector with business acumen in business development, operational management, customer service, and human resource management. Andrea is also a former small business owner of "Affairs Remembered" where she provided elegant, exceptional event planning services in the Northern Virginia area presenting weddings, workshops, themed parties, and décor.

She has been a proud member of the sisterhood of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. for 47 years. Mrs. Bailey has been a member of Omicron Chi Omega for 10 years. Her determination to expand and grow the exposure of women is evident in her appointment as a national board member with the National Coalition of 100 Black Women, Inc. and as a charter member for the Prince William County chapter in 2012.

Mrs. Bailey is a national member of the Professional Women; of which she was given the Who's Who Award of Professional Woman in the spring of 2015. As a social justice advocate, she is an Executive Committee member for the Prince William County NAACP, where she serves the community aside her husband who is the President.

In 2019 Andrea won her local election by 64% as one of the first African American female County Supervisors serving in the Potomac District in Prince William County. She currently serves as the Vice Chair of the Board of County Supervisors in Prince William County, Va. She is married to Rev. Cozy Eugene Bailey, current President of the Prince William County NAACP, for over forty-seven years.

Sonya L. Greene, Ph.D.



Dr. Sonya L. Greene currently serves as a Program/Contract Manager for a government contractor, Guardians of Honor, providing direct support to the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) in the Office of STEM Engagement at NASA Headquarters. With over 17 years of experience as a researcher, program administrator, and analyst, she holds a bachelor's degree in biology from Morgan State University and a Ph.D. degree in Immunology and Microbiology from Wayne State University School of Medicine.

Prior to leading the Guardians of Honor team, Dr. Greene served as a Sr. Program Analyst for the National Space Grant and Fellowship Program at NASA HQ, University Affairs Officer at NASA Ames Research Center, and as the Director of Workforce Development at the United Negro College Fund Special Programs Corporation (UNCFSP). In this capacity, she was responsible for the management and oversight of a multi-million-dollar portfolio of federally funded educational programs designed to prepare the underrepresented and underserved minority higher education community to be value-added contributors in today's rapidly changing global marketplace.

Dr. Greene has also served as a Fellowships in Research and Science Teaching (FIRST) Postdoctoral Fellow and a Howard Hughes Curriculum Development Fellow at Emory University School of Medicine and Morehouse College. The FIRST program, which places a strong emphasis on both research and science education, has provided the foundation for Dr. Greene's interest in developing, implementing, and cultivating quality science education programs for students and faculty. Working with students to help bridge the gap from the research lab to the classroom through innovative programs, curriculum design, and methodologies has become one of her passions. These valuable experiences allow her to bring a unique and innovative perspective to research and science education programming. Her focus on working with and mentoring young people in science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics (STEAM), underscores the importance of representation, awareness, and accessibility to both resources and opportunities.

A native of Florence, South Carolina, Dr. Greene currently resides in South Riding, Virginia, and is a proud, active member of the Loudoun County Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta, Sorority, Inc.; Reston (VA) Chapter of the Links, Incorporated; Charter Member and Current President of the Advocates for the Arts Chapter of the Society, Incorporated, and Alfred Street Baptist Church. She is passionate about being involved in the community and being of service to others. In her spare time, she enjoys reading, traveling, skiing, and spending time with family and friends.

Shani Hosten



Shani W. Hosten is a graduate of Hampton University, she credits the university with providing her with an education for life and for shaping much of who she is today. She is a member of the Alpha Kappa Alpha, Sorority, Incorporated, and also a member of the Reston (VA) Chapter of The Links, Incorporated.

Out of college, Mrs. Hosten began her professional career with Eli Lilly where she experienced firsthand how a brand can change people's lives. She has direct insight into how the company's insulin, anti-depressants, and antibiotics drugs impacted the lives of patients. She is currently with AARP Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) leading the African American/Black audience strategy as well as LGBTQ+. Her interest is in healthcare disparity, and lack of equitable access to quality healthcare, primarily in these populations. She has a personal commitment to help bridge the healthcare disparity gaps that unfortunately and unbelievably still exist in the United States in 2023.

Her education work focuses on decreasing healthcare disparities, dispelling myths, and improving overall wellness in local and national multigenerational communities of color. Mrs. Hosten helps to develop culturally relevant information for physicians and subject matter experts to help their patients develop trust and to dispel misinformation that negatively impacts the health and overall well-being of African Americans.

Mrs. Hosten has been recognized nationally for her DEI leadership and outreach. She was recognized by the 2022 third quarter edition of the Profiles in Diversity Journal International, www.diversityjournal.com in which she speaks of faith, family, and fulfillment leading her on her current journey. CIO Views Digital Magazine featured Mrs. Hosten on the front cover of the March 2023 edition as a Servant DE&I Leader who is positively impacting people's lives. In this edition, there is a feature and interview with her as one of the 5 Most Influential Women in Diversity and Inclusion to Follow, 2023.

Mrs. Hosten has a local and national platform to impact the disparity in healthcare and the well-being of African Americans. She always uses her voice for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion to positively impact lives daily and to advance the innovation that needs to be done in this area.

Gigi McMillan



Gigi McMillan is a wife, mother, sister, and grandmother who values family friends, food, and fun times in the sun. She has lived in Prince William County for many years and now resides in Woodbridge, Virginia. One of her favorite quotes coined by Vince Lombardi, the legendary coach of the Green Bay Packers and the Washington Commanders, reads as "If you'll not settle for anything less than the best, you will be amazed at what you can accomplish in your life."

Mrs. McMillan is the Chief Creative Officer of Kamisol Style Consultancy, Inc. Gigi received her Merchandising and Visual Branding degree from Sanford-Brown College. In 2018, Path-to-Purchase nominated Gigi for the Women of Excellence Award. They identified her as a "Leader in Business". Her work as a visual artist was published in Modern Luxury magazine, Grace Ormonde Modern Luxury Wedding, Washington Parent, NOVA Magazine, Simply Weddings, and Munaluchi Bride among others.

Mrs. McMillan was a National Coalition of 100 Black Women (NCBW) member. She is currently active in the Association of Image Consultants International (AICI) and the Empowerment Group by Feria. She sits on the advisory committee for Bernie House and she recently established her international life coaching certification with the Beautiful You Coaching Community.

As the Founder of Purple Runway in 2015, Mrs. McMillan built a platform for domestic violence survivors to celebrate and highlight those who moved from victim to victor, As a survivor herself she was determined to fill the gap and help remove the shame that comes with it. Over the years Purple Runway has received support from Senator Tim Kaine, the National Network to End Domestic Violence Purple Purse, Saks Fifth Avenue, The Bernie House, Women Giving Back, Change in Action, Women's Center, DC Trust, and Georgetown University, and Mercedes Benz of Arlington year after year.

Purple Runway has assisted survivors with school supplies, coats, food and housing, advocacy counseling, and more through donations and volunteer hours. Since the pandemic, They continue to assist on an as-needed basis those who have overcome adversity and applaud lawmakers for the reconsideration of H.R. 1585 (Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2019), which has passed the House. Jinnae (Nickey) Monroe



Jinnae (Nickey) Monroe is President and Chief Executive Officer for Professional by Design. Jinnae is a lead facilitator for the University of Maryland 2-day Boot-to-Business course for active military members who plan to start a business. While holding tenure as a professor of Human Resources for Master's Degree-seeking students; she also heads up a nonprofit.

Jinnae founded HireGround, with a mission of ensuring high school students have a solid plan beyond high school graduation. After year one, HireGround was recognized with the Colgan Award for community advocacy. This year, HireGround was recognized as Veteran-Owned Business of the Year. The same year, Jinnae was recognized as the Manassas Education Volunteer of the Year.

In 2021, Jinnae created the first ever Entrepreneur \$1,000 Annual Scholarship which has increased to \$1,500. She challenged other local businesses to initiate scholarships in the reception industries. In the past 12 months, Jinnae has been able to raise 500K which was used to supply new winter shoes for low-income students and convinces DSW and Target to participate.

Ms. Monroe has provided career development for several hundred students which led to Macy's giving her organization \$2,500.00 to buy interview attire for her students. Her nonprofit purchased scrubs for the entire nursing program at a local high school, and she convinced another business to join in and provide uniforms for auto mechanic students.

HireGround also partnered with Prince William (PW) Library to create career plans for the PW Youth Detention teens. Ms. Monroe partnered with Edu-Futro (an undocumented student program) to provide training on how to earn post-graduate internships. Jinnae's non-profit also provides an online tutorial for English as a Second Language (ESOL) students to learn English with at least four of their family members through a grant awarded by Sentara Hospital. HireGround was awarded funds to assist with the rent backlog for many Prince William County residents, providing rental assistance in the amount of \$250K.

Ms. Monroe served 15 years in the US Air Force & Air National Guard, 10 years as an education Training Manager, and 5 years as a Law Enforcement Patrolman. During this time, she served special duties for the Philippines President and a U.S. President. She was promoted without testing for exceptional performance. Jinnae earned Non-Commissioned Officer of the Year, Law Enforcement of the Year, and Exceptional Military Professionalism awards. Besides these, she has earned numerous military medals.
