DESCRIPTION

The Northern Virginia Kappa Achievement Foundation (NVKAF) Scholarship is based on a student's academic achievement and participation in school/community organizations and activities. Applicants must have a minimum of 3.0 grade point average. They must write a 350-word (maximum) essay on a topic (listed on the application) to submit with their scholarship application. The application process also requires three letters of recommendation, transcripts, and in some cases, an interview. The scholarship is \$1000.00. The scholarship committee selects a recipient based on their academic achievement, character, and leadership. Enclosed is a copy of the Scholarship Application and a description of the scholarship to be posted in your school. Deadline to submit application is **April 10, 2026**

The Northern Virginia Kappa Achievement Foundation is sponsoring a scholarship with preference given to applicants in the Northern Virginia area that apply. The applicant must be a graduating high school senior, with a grade point average of 3.0 or better.

Please submit all high school transcript. Also, the applicant should provide an essay (350 words maximum) to demonstrate a high-level participation in school and other community volunteerism and provide three letters of recommendation.

The applicant must be accepted to an accredited four-year institution at the time the scholarship is received. This scholarship is worth \$1000. The Northern Virginia Kappa Achievement Foundation scholarship committee will select the scholarship recipient based on activism, leadership, achievement, moral character, and commitment to the objectives of Kappa League. **All materials are due to the selection committee by April 10, 2026. GUIDELINES

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1. Scholarship awards are open to graduating seniors in all public and private high schools in Northern, Virginia geographical area who meet criteria prescribed in items below.
2. The Scholarship Selection Committee will select scholarship recipients after all candidates have been screened. The Northern Virginia Kappa Achievement Foundation, Inc. Board of Directors will approve their selection.
3. Candidates for scholarship awards must meet the following criteria:
 - a. Have a high school grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale
 - b. Be a graduating senior of a public or private high school in Loudoun County, Virginia
 - c. Be involved in school and community activities (e.g., student government, honor society, sports, clubs, church, volunteer work, etc.)
 - d. Submit three letters of recommendation, one of which must be from a school administrator or faculty member. (e.g., school, community, social, and personal reference)
 - e. Be accepted to an accredited four-year institution of high learning for the next school year. Scholarships shall be limited to the students attending "educational institutions" as defined in the United States Tax Code
 - f. Submit an official high school transcript.
4. Any relatives of members of the selection committee, or its officers, directors, or substantial contributors are not eligible for this award.
5. Disbursements will be made to the student upon notification of enrollment in a qualifying college. If the student withdraws from school or is found to have misused the funds, the scholarship will be revoked.

CHECKLIST FOR THE NORTHERN VIRGINIA KAPPA LEAGUE SCHOLARSHIP

- I. Complete all three parts of the application form; type or print in black ink.
- II. Write an essay (350 words maximum). Include a statement about your level of participation in the volunteer activities. Additional information may include the following: How



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long have you been in the organization? What did you contribute to the group? Can you provide examples of your leadership with the group? Did you help to organize or implement specific activities? How did your presence in the group help your peers? What did you learn from your participation in the club/organization?

III. Obtain three (3) letters of recommendation. These letters should speak to your leadership, activism and commitment to making your community a better place. Letters should accompany the application in sealed envelopes. Letters may be from a teacher, employer, a volunteer, supervisor, school counselor, pastor, etc.

IV. Include in the application packet an official high school transcript. Submit the transcript in a sealed envelope with the signature of the school official. Your guidance counselor can assist you with this requirement.

All scholarship monies must be claimed within 12 calendar months of being awarded or the award will be withdrawn.
